ANSWER TO EVIL - A DREAM FOR OUR TIME



Murray writes:

I cordially invite you to join me in discussion of a numinous dream of transcendence within. It is a dream for our time and not only for the dreamer. The dream shows us a fifth dimension within the matrix of our lives.

Murray Stein, Ph.D. is a Training and Supervising Analyst at the International School of Analytical Psychology Zurich (ISAP-ZURICH). He has been president of the International Association for Analytical Psychology (IAAP) and President of ISAP-ZURICH and lectures internationally. He is the author of *Jung's Map of the Soul, Outside Inside and All Around, The Mystery of Transformation* and many other books and articles. Six volumes of his Collected Writings have been published to date. He lives in Switzerland and has a private practice in Zurich and from his home in Goldiwil.

Murray continues:

Dreams sometimes bring us an experience of the ineffable. They strike us as numinous and mysterious. They are what Jung, in his homely Swiss fashion, called 'big dreams'. Such dreams offer us symbols that surprise and puzzle us, at least at first, and surpass our present conceptual understanding.

Symbols are more than metaphors, which may delight and amuse us. Rather, they take us, if we follow them far enough, into a realm of the mysterious unknown and perhaps even the unknowable.

The experiential component will be an exercise in active imagination using the dream discussed in the lecture.

Diane writes:

When Russia lawlessly invaded Ukraine, I was shocked and outraged. It was scarcely believable that this kind of barbarism was happening all over again to a European country in the 21st century. Here in South Devon, local artists like myself came together and donated their work for a fund-raising exhibition for Ukraine. It drew a lot of people. In London, my nephew set up an online charity to raise funds for Ukrainians who needed to flee the conflict. Since that time a whole year has passed. The Russian war of aggression grinds brutally on. It's a dismaying example of human evil. On the other hand, we are sincerely impressed and moved by the courage, skill and resilience of the Ukrainian people.
